Recreation

The Golf Club at Table Creek, 5633 I Road, Nebraska City. 402-873-7710. Strategic placed bunkers and water hazards, combined with rolling countryside and wooded areas, make for challenging rounds of golf for players of all abilities.

Wildwood Golf Course & Park, 1101 Wildwood Lane, Nebraska City. 402-873-3661. This municipal course boasts a well-manicured, 9-hole layout. The park includes a historic museum, playground, picnic areas, dog park, disc golf course, and sand volleyball pit.

Steamboat Trace Trail, Nearly 22 miles of the Steamboat Trace Trail are open from west of the Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) Power Station (south of Nebraska City) to Cooper Nuclear Station (south of Brownville). The route, a classic rail-trails, is flat and the surface consists of crushed limestone. Great for biking or walking.

Waubonsie State Park, 2585 Waubonsie Park Road, Hamburg, IA. Enjoy 7 miles of foot trails and 8 miles of equestrian trails winding along ridges, gorges, and valleys.

Museums & Attractions

Arbor Lodge State Historical Park, 2600 Arbor Ave, Nebraska City. 402-873-7222.

Home of J. Sterling Morton, founder of Arbor Day and Secretary of Agriculture under President Cleveland. The 52-room mansion is located on a 72-acre arboretum with a lilac walk featuring over 200 varieties of lilacs. Open Tues - Sun, 11 am - 5 pm.

Civil War Museum, GAR Hall, 910 1st Corso, Nebraska City. 402-873-4018. Dedicated to preserving the history of the Civil War. Open Thurs - Sat, 12 - 4 pm, April to October.

Kimmel Harding Nelson Arts Center, 801 3rd Corso, Nebraska City. Offers a residency program for working artists looking for respite to concentrate on their work. Gallery is open to the public Mon - Fri, 10 am - 5 pm.

Kregel Windmill Factory Museum, 1416 Central Ave, Nebraska City. 402-873-1078.

This museum has been described as a time capsule of the early 20th-century manufacturing shop. Open Friday & Saturday, 10:30 am - 5 pm.

Lewis & Clark Visitor Center, 100 Valmont Dr, Nebraska City. 402-874-9900. Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center sits on a scenic 79 acre wooded bluff overlooking the Missouri River. The flora and fauna (178 new plants and 122 new animals) and scientific discoveries recorded by the Lewis & Clark Expedition (1804-1806) are the focus of the Center. Open Mon - Sat, 10 am - 4 pm, Sun, 12 - 4 pm.

Nebraska City Museum of Firefighting, 1320 Central Ave, Nebraska City. 402-873-4403. The purpose of the museum is to educate the public about fire safety and the history of firefighting in Nebraska City. Open Wed - Sat, 11 am - 5 pm, Sun, 12 - 4 pm.

Old Freighters Museum, 407 N 14th St, Nebraska City. This museum's mission is focused on the interpreting the significance of the freighting and shipping industry in the development of Nebraska City. Open Thurs - Sun, 12 - 4 pm.

Nelson House, 711 3rd Corso, Nebraska City. The Taylor-Wessel-Bickel-Nelson House is a museum inside an 1857 brick home which sits on one of Nebraska City's historic brick streets. Exhibits are from Nebraska's territorial era. Open Thurs - Sun, 12 - 4 pm.

Wildwood Historic Center, 420 Steinhart Park Rd, Nebraska City. Built in 1869, the ten-room Gothic style Wildwood House brings to life the Victorian era in early Nebraska. The house is furnished as it would have been when Jasper and Ellen Ware lived there "amidst the wild wood." Open Mon - Sat, 10 am - 5 pm and Sun, 1 - 5 pm.
